PARK REPORT

Another summer & fall season gone! I'll never understand how weeks and months go by so fast but the next year somehow always seems to go by a bit quicker than the last. I hear that's a normal feeling... 2023 was a year of change. New roles, a Naturalist, and of course, a new master plan.

In late 2022 I took a new position after former Superintendent **Dawn Bishop** retired. This doubled my duties, as the Rib Mountain-Council Grounds work unit fell from three to two full-time positions. Hopefully that's just short-term. Luckily, we once again had a great seasonal crew to help keep the park in shape. Everyone from 2022 returned for another year (I may have done a happy dance when everyone said they were coming back) so I was able to let this veteran crew handle day-to-day work at the park when I was occupied elsewhere.

One of the returning employees was **Ally Noll**. In spring, we successfully applied for an Incentive Grant, and for the first time in well over a decade, we had a Naturalist at the park! Ally hit the ground running after working part-time as a Natural Resource Educator at the Mead Wildlife Area, and with her experience in the Natural Resource Education field. Ally conducted a number of educational programs, led hikes, and created selfguided programs, so it's been fantastic having her back as our Park Naturalist.

Over the past year, the DNR master plan for the park finally got approved after years of planning, research, and public input. There haven't yet been any physical changes to the park yet since the final plan was released earlier this fall. Initial discussions have begun on mountain biking trails, and in 2024

What a busy and exciting year for the Friends of Rib Mountain State Park! The Friends have been extremely fortunate to receive a number of grants and donations from supporters including The Friends of Wisconsin State Parks Incentive Grant, a Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Grant, an Impact 100 Merit Award, a Cellcom Green Gifts Award, Community Foundation/ Greenheck/Wisconsin Arts Grant, Tourism Commission Grant from the Village of Rib Mountain, and other donations from Kiwanis, Chase Outdoors, and Rib Mountain Cycles.

This added support and funding helped facilitate outdoor education, entertainment, and the enjoyment of Rib Mountain State Park throughout this year. Two magnificent candlelight snowshoe hikes supplied a fantastic start to the year, thanks to Karen Graff's army of Friends volunteers. Many themed guided hikes throughout the year including wildflower hikes, a birding hike, history hike, and an ecology hike happened thanks to Wes Ebert and Karen Graff. Park Naturalist Ally Noll has been a wonderful addition to the Park this year developing programs, providing hands-on education to groups and visitors, and coordinating a series of guided hikes and drop-in events. Two enjoyable summer Concerts in the Clouds happened thanks to the Concert Committee. Many nature programs this year included Snake Discovery - Reptiles from Around the World, Park favorite Raptor Program by REGI, and an intriguing All About Bats program presented by Lucia Johnson (and special guest Edgar) from North Lakeland Discovery Center.

The park hosted several VIP visitors this year including Governor **Tony Evers**, DNR Secretary **Adam Payne**, DNR Parks Director **Steven Schmelzer**, Natural Resource Board Members **Bill Smith & Nancy West** to see first hand the wonders of the Park and discuss the possible impacts of the newly adopted Park Master Plan.

With the funding raised in 2023 we are assessing enhancements to the upper loop road to provide a safer path for park visitor pedestrian use. We are hoping to

and beyond we will see planning for some of the changes and additional recreational opportunities.

The year was also a busy one for grant activity. We applied for the Impact100 and Stewardship Grants, and were awarded about \$34,000. Project planning has begun to use these funds to expand the paved walking path at the congested and narrow western edge of Park Road, and replace the amphitheater barrier with a safer stone pilaster and cable railing (now scheduled for May 2024). Both will greatly improve safety and aesthetics in these areas popular with park visitors.

Outside of grants and master plans, we again had a large number of volunteers who helped park staff accomplish many projects this year. Preliminary numbers show almost 700 volunteer hours! Lots of staining, board replacing, and bridge rebuilding added to our usual seasonal tasks. I'm grateful to manage a property with such robust interest from community members helping maintain the park.

WILDFLOWER, BIRDING AND HISTORY HIKES

the birds that call the Turkey Vulture and Homestead Trails home. May is the best spring wildflower time, and we led walks for the public on May 6 and May 20, and had a great time identifying the many gorgeous wildflowers that call this part of the Park home due to its deciduous trees and small streams. On June 3. Myles Hurlburt and members of the Wausau Birding Club led the "early birds" on a hike, educating us on the local birds and helping us identify their calls. These hikes are amazing, and we hope you will let your friends know about them.
